The **Resume Correction Drive**, held on April 16, 2025, marked the second day of the ongoing *Resume Building + Review Drive* initiative at Sandip University. Organized under the joint efforts of the **School of Computer Science & Engineering (SOCSE)** and the **Directorate of Student Welfare (DSW)**, and executed by the **SECT: Open-Source Community** and **Leads Club**, this session aimed to offer hands-on, personalized assistance to students for refining their resumes. Building upon the feedback provided during Phase 1 of the drive, students received expert guidance and live corrections to transform their resumes into impactful, industry-ready documents. The event also emphasized the importance of structured presentation, content relevance, and ATS-friendliness to enhance professional opportunities for students across all academic years.

Overview

As a continuation of the Resume Building + Review Drive (Phase 1), the **Resume Correction Drive (Day 2)** was held with a hands-on approach to refining and improving student resumes. Held on April 16, 2025, the session focused on live corrections, personalized guidance, and the application of feedback provided during Phase 1's AI + Human reviews.

This drive served as a unique opportunity for students to **actively work on resume improvements with guidance**, bringing together reviewers, mentors, and AI-powered tools in a collaborative setup.

Event Highlights

1. Live Resume Correction Booths

Students received one-on-one guidance on:

- Structuring sections for clarity and professionalism
- Improving grammar, tone, and content strength
- Enhancing ATS (Applicant Tracking System) compatibility
- Matching resumes to targeted roles/internships

2. Peer + Mentor Support

Volunteers from the SECT and Leads communities assisted students in implementing feedback from the initial review phase. Key focus areas included:

- Formatting
- Bullet point optimization (using STAR method)
- LinkedIn headline suggestions
- Summary writing techniques

3. AI-powered Tools Demo

Participants were introduced to AI-powered feedback and optimization tools, showing how technology can assist in self-evaluating resumes.

4. Mentorrd Platform Integration

Students who needed additional personalized support were connected with **Mentorrd**, our partnering resume & career guidance platform, for:

- Final polish
- LinkedIn profile reviews
- Mentorship session

Participation & Engagement

- **Total Participants:** 450+
- **Volunteers/Reviewers Involved:** 20+
- **Resume Correction Participants:** 65+
- **Resume Templates Downloads:** 300+

Students from all years and departments participated, with first and second-year students showing strong enthusiasm to improve their resumes for internship season.

Event Impact

This event had a significant impact on the participants by:

- **Increased Resume Confidence:** Over 85% of participants reported feeling significantly more confident in their resumes post-correction.
- **Professional Awareness:** Students gained clarity on what industry professionals and recruiters value.
- **Skill Building:** Students learned resume writing frameworks that they can apply lifelong.

Registration and Participation

The registration process was conducted online through a WhatsApp Group (Over 450+ Students from University & Foundation) and registration link provided in the event poster and in the WhatsApp group as well. Due to the open-to-all nature of the event, we collected over 400+ Resumes for reviews Online & 60+ Offline

Promotion & Awareness Campaign

To ensure maximum outreach and engagement, extensive promotional efforts were made before the event. Various marketing channels, including social media, posters, and word-of-mouth campaigns, were utilized to generate awareness about the event. The organizing team actively engaged with students and faculty members to encourage participation.

Promotional strategies included:

- **Social Media Campaigns** – Posts, videos, and countdowns on platforms like Instagram, LinkedIn, and Twitter.
- **On-Campus Promotions** – Flyers, banners, and standees were placed across the university to attract students' attention.
- **Faculty Endorsement** – Faculty members were encouraged to promote the event in their respective classes to boost participation.
- **Community Engagement** – Collaborations with open-source communities and clubs helped in spreading awareness beyond the university.

These promotional efforts played a crucial role in achieving an impressive turnout of 450+ participants, making the event a grand success.
