A guest lecture on **“Intellectual Property Rights”** organized by the Department of Basic Engineering Sciences on Dt. 23-05-2022 for the First Year B.Tech. students. The eminent speaker was **Dr. Ritesh R. Palkar, Associate Professor, Department of Chemical Engg., Marwadi University, Rajkot Gujarat.**

Mr. Lalit R. Patil sir explained what is the definition of Intellectual Property Rights? The Intellectual property rights (IPR) refers to the legal rights given to the inventor or creator to protect his invention or creation for a certain period of time. Intellectual property rights are the rights given to persons over the creations of their minds. They usually give the creator an exclusive right over the use of his/her creation for a certain period of time.

Sir discussed the two main areas of IPR:

1. Copyright and rights related to copyright

The rights of authors of literary and artistic works such as books and other writings, musical compositions, paintings, sculpture, computer programs and

films are protected by copyright, for a minimum period of 50 years after the death of the author.

Copyright and related rights are the rights of performers e.g. actors, singers and musicians, producers of phonograms (sound recordings) and broadcasting organizations. The main social purpose of protection of copyright and related rights is to encourage and reward creative work.

2. Industrial property

Industrial property can usefully be divided into two main areas:

One area can be characterized as the protection of distinctive signs, in particular trademarks and geographical indications which identify a good as originating in a place where a given characteristic of the good is essentially a creditable to its geographical origin. The protection of such distinctive signs aims to stimulate and ensure fair competition and to protect consumers, by enabling them to make informed choices between various goods and services.

A functioning intellectual property rules should also facilitate the transfer of technology in the form of foreign direct investment, joint ventures and licensing.

Further sir also summarized the examples of intellectual property rights which include patents, domain names, industrial design, confidential information, invention, moral rights, database rights, and works of authorship, service marks, logos, trademarks, design rights, business or trade names, commercial secrets, computer software.
