YERWADA CENTRAL JAIL VISIT REPORT

Outline of the Event: School of Law, Sandip University organised the Yerwada Jail, Pune visit for the students to have the practical approach of the understanding of how a Jail functions, rehabilitation and its administration.

Objective: To understand the practical applicability of rehabilitation and the administration of Jail and how the sanction system works.

Outcome: The students and faculty of School of Law Sandip University started their journey by morning 5 am to visit Yerwada Jail from Sandip University Campus picking the students and faculties from bus stops assignment and without any intervals reached the destination by 10.45 am.

As soon as the students reached the location the students were gathered near the main gate of the Yerwada Jail, we were asked to assemble according to the list provided and gave instructions to the students and faculties on the conduct of the Jail visit.

As soon as we were allowed to enter the jail gate, all the students and faculties were thoroughly checked and allowed to move forward and were guided by Jail Officer Mr. Chandrakant Sangle and a guard Miss Sonali. First the students visited the Museum where Mahatma Gandhi ji, Motilal Nehru ji and Jawaharlal Nehru ji were kept in the jail. Further the students visited the kitchen where the prisoners prepare the food for inmates themselves. The students saw the demo Thali in which roti, sabji, rice and daal is served to prisoners. Students came to know that prisoners can also buy food from canteen like pickle, jam, bread, etc.

Students visited various manufactury units in prison. First visited to Carpentry unit, where prisoners are being trained here for manufacturing of wooden furniture for government departments. Furniture for the general public is also manufactured and supplied as per the order. Then they visited in smithy unit where average of 20 prisoners are being trained there. The products are mainly used in prisons but are also available to the general public at reasonable prices. Almirahs, utensils, etc. required for public are manufactured and supplied on demand. Students saw the cells where undertrial prisoners and convicted prisoners are kept in custody.

Students visited the office of Free Legal Aid services and Video Conferencing. Prisoners talk with the Advocates or their relatives through online mode.

Female students visited the women jail also. Students learnt the health facility for female prisoners and arrangements done for infant children of female prisoners.
