These myths not only perpetuate harmful stereotypes but also contribute to a culture that normalizes and justifies mistreatment, thereby exacerbating the plight of women facing various forms of victimization.

Addressing these issues necessitates a multifaceted approach. First, education and awareness campaigns are crucial to debunking myths and fostering a more empathetic and informed understanding of the challenges women encounter. Empowering women through education and economic opportunities can also significantly reduce vulnerabilities. Additionally, stringent legal frameworks, along with effective implementation and enforcement, are essential to ensure accountability for perpetrators and protect women's rights. Cultivating a culture of respect,

equality, and support is fundamental in paving the way forward toward a world where women are free from victimization and discrimination.

The speaker gave various examples to the students and tried to make the session interactive with the students. The session ended with reciting of Preamble of Constitution by all the students.
