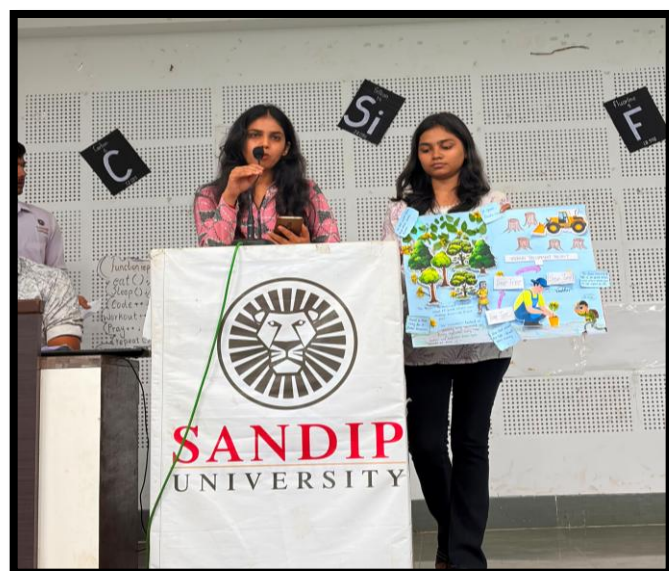
The event successfully promoted student participation and provided a platform for students to showcase their creativity and innovative ideas. The Reel Making Competition, particularly the
