Brief description of Event:

The **Department of Forensic Science, School of Science, Sandip University**, organized an educational visit to the **Cyber Police Station, Nashik** for **Third Year B.Sc. Forensic Science and M.Sc. Forensic Science students**. The visit was conducted with the objective of providing practical exposure to cybercrime investigation, digital evidence handling, and the functioning of a specialized cyber law enforcement unit.

During the visit, cyber police officials explained the organizational structure and day-to-day functioning of the Cyber Police Station.
